Housing Rehabilitation Assistance Program

0% Interest Home Improvement Loans

The Prince George’s County Department of Housing and Community Development has partnered with Housing Initiative Partnership and the PG County Redevelopment Authority to provide home improvement/repairs loans of up to \$60,000 to eligible homeowners.

Eligible Applicants

- Must own and occupy a home in PG County
- Must be current on mortgage payments, property tax and property Insurance
- Cannot have an “underwater” mortgage
- Total household income may not exceed program limits

Emporium's Summer Arts Learning



This year's Summer Arts Learning program is at Elizabeth Seton High School with Joe's Movement Emporium. There are two sessions: July 9 to 20 and July 23 to August 3 (both run Monday through Friday from 9am to 4pm). Performance & Art Exhibitions are scheduled for July 20 at 4pm and August 3 at 4pm.

The two-week, full-day summer arts camp sessions are for students ages 7-13. Campers are divided by age into groups. Each session culminates with a performance showcase and art exhibition open to families. In addition, a "Special Family Creative Arts Night" will be held Friday night during the program, to allow parents to engage with the camp experience.

Reminder!

Let's not forget **yard waste pick up** occurs *Mondays* only. Tree debris should be placed in lawn bags, while larger pieces may be tied in bundles of 40 lbs. or less.

While on the subject, **regular trash pickup** occurs Tuesdays and Fridays. **Bulk trash** is also picked up on Tuesday. Only four (4) items will be picked up at a time. Also, no construction materials, auto parts, or paint cans are allowed. The truck comes early on Fridays; we advise *you* to put trash and recyclables out on Thursday night or early Friday morning. Once your trash has been picked up, please do not leave empty containers in front of your house.

Note: It is illegal to burn leaves and other materials outside. You will be fined!

Important notice: Maryland Homeowners' Property Tax Credit Program

Under state law, you may be eligible for a substantial credit on your home's property tax bill. This program is available to homeowners of all ages; the credit is calculated on gross income. Contact 410.767.4433.

Do You Have All of Your Permits???

Before beginning a project on your property, you must have all of the required county and Town permits in your possession. You should first check with Prince George's County for necessary permits before requesting a Town permit. All Town permits are \$25 and must be displayed in a front window.

If you fail to obtain permits, you're subject to: heavy fines, an order to stop or tear down/remove work done, and a court appearance requirement.

So, why not do the right thing and follow the rules?

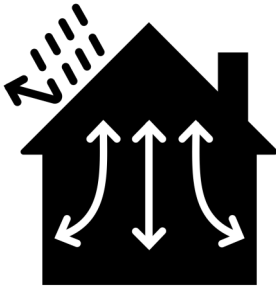

Weatherization Grants for PG Co Homeowners



The Bladensburg Police Department, COPS program, and Cities and Towns in Prince George’s County, Maryland are providing weatherization upgrades to homeowners (who qualify) *at no cost*.

This program is funded by grants from Maryland Energy Administration (MEA) and DHCD, with the aim of making Maryland homes more comfortable and energy efficient. Weatherizing your home will reduce the cost of energy and save money!

To qualify, Prince George’s County homeowners must meet income criteria (see table below) and be willing to provide documentation (pages 1 and 2 of Federal Income Tax Return).

Number of People Living in House	Owner(s) Only Annual Income Less than
1	\$65,700
2	\$75,050
3	\$84,400
4	\$93,750
5	\$100,300
6	\$108,800

Upon meeting the income criteria, your home will be inspected to see if there are problems that will render your home ineligible (e.g., mold, standing water in the basement, major plumbing issues, hoarding, and roofing leaks) for weatherization under this program.

North Brentwood residents may apply by picking up the “Affidavit of Income” form at the Town office. This is a very simple form to complete. It must be filled out and sent to Lieutenant Jim Flynn by fax 301.209.7152 or by email to jflynn@bladensburg.net for processing, ASAP.

Energy Assistance Still Available for DC/MD Residents

Energy Assistance is still available to help Pepco customers pay for winter energy bills. Through the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LAIHEAP), you could receive up to \$1500 in grant support toward your energy bill that **does not have to be paid back**.

Maryland’s income eligibility requirements:

- \$21,105 (one-person household)
- \$28,420 (two-person household)
- \$35,735 (three-person household)
- \$43,050 (four-person household)

Maryland’s New Smoke Alarm Law

Our state law changed and many are unaware. Here are the new smoke alarm requirements (which took effect January 1, 2018):

1. Replace all BATTERY-ONLY operated smoke alarms with units powered by sealed-in, 10-year long-life batteries.
2. All smoke alarms have expiration dates. Both hard-wired and battery-operated smoke alarms must be replaced every 10 years. If your smoke alarm hasn’t been replaced since 2007, it’s time!
3. Location, location, location – smoke alarms are required to be located outside of each sleeping area and on every level of your home including basements (finished or unfinished).

For homes built since 1994, smoke alarms have been required *inside* all sleeping rooms. For maximum protection, fire officials recommend installing smoke alarms in sleeping rooms regardless of the year of construction.

Profile: Evan Dame, Councilman and National Kidney Foundation Speaker



Evan Dame has been battling chronic kidney disease since the age of seven and kidney failure since he was 27. He was on dialysis for nearly six years before receiving a transplant (at George Washington University Hospital), which completely transformed his life.

However, the journey from dialysis to now (one year post-transplant) has not been without its challenges, including dietary and weight requirements. Evan battled obesity most of his life: at his heaviest, he weighed 350 lbs. Learning from his doctors and dietitians that his weight not only increased his risk of dying while on dialysis, but dashed any hopes he had of ever receiving a transplant, Evan took matter into his own hands. As of today, he has lost 150 lbs.

Evan is the healthiest he has ever been, and he is always eager to share his story, hoping it will inspire others.

Medicare: New Card and Scam Warning

This is important for those with Medicare, and for adult children helping parents with Medicare. Here's what you need to know to protect yourself, family and friends.

New Medicare Cards

On April 1, Medicare started a year-long project to replace all beneficiaries' current Medicare cards with cards using alphanumeric IDs. Currently, the ID number is your social security number. The new Medicare card will come in the mail. You don't need to request it.

What's the Scam?

Someone calls and says they're from Medicare. They tell you that you're getting a new Medicare card; but, until it comes, you'll need a temporary card for a fee of \$5 - 50. They'll ask for personal information, and a bank account or credit card to "process" your temporary card.

Things to Remember

Medicare will never call you unless you ask them to. All Medicare communications are by mail. Don't believe anyone who says they "work with Medicare to make sure you get everything you are entitled to."

Protect Yourself from this One

Spread the word. Call-screen with your answering machine; don't answer unknown numbers. If you do get scammed, take action to protect against identity theft.

Notice of Elections | May 7, 2018

The Town of North Brentwood will hold an election on Monday, May 7, 2018. Polls will open at 1pm and close at 7pm at the Municipal Center, 4009 Wallace Road, North Brentwood, Maryland. Use the side entrance of the building.

All registered voters of North Brentwood will vote for (2) two council members for Wards I and III to represent the Town. If you are registered to vote with the Prince George's County Board of Elections, and live at a North Brentwood address, then you are registered to vote in Town elections.

Absentee ballots will be accepted. Those who will be absent during the election or who cannot appear to vote at the polls on Election Day (because of illness or physical disability) may apply to vote by absentee ballot. An application or letter stating the need for an absentee ballot (including the reason why you will not be able to appear) must be received at the Town office by April 24 cob/close of business, which is 1pm. Your request will be reviewed and, if granted, you will receive an absentee ballot. The completed ballot must be mailed in a sealed envelope and received in the Town's office by Friday, April 27, cob, 1pm.

Petitions for Candidates

In order for a candidate's name to appear on ballot, he or she must have resided in the Town for at least one year, immediately preceding the election, and be a qualified voter. Each candidate for a councilmember seat must submit a petition with 10 signatures of registered Town voters (it's advisable to get more than 10).

Petitions may be obtained at the Town's office or at www.northbrentwood.com. Your candidacy petition must be delivered to one of the judges no later than Monday, April 9, 2018, cob, 5:30pm. An election judge will certify each petition.
