RE: NEW DIMISSAL PROCEDURES

Parents and Guardians,

In an effort to improve pick-up procedures and continue to ensure the safety of our students, we will be changing the traffic pattern during dismissal. After meeting with local law enforcement agents, we agreed to implement new pick-up procedures starting **JANUARY 2nd, 2014**. We appreciate your assistance in following the new guidelines.

New Pick-up procedures starting JANUARY 2nd (Please see the attached diagram):

1. BETWEEN **1:45 AND 2:15**, ALL cars will enter and exit through the *new entrance*.
2. After entering, adults **must remain in their cars** if they are going to pick up their children (unattended cars will be ticketed).
3. **The cars will go around the loop and the children will get in when instructed by the staff member.** ALL CHILDREN WILL BE WAITING IN THE DESIGNATED AREA. If the child is not ready, the car will have to exit and re-entry the parking lot
4. Cars will then proceed around and exit the parking lot through the same entrance.
5. Students and families who are walking home must exit the campus through the other two entrances; they may not walk through the new entrance

****Please inform the students that they are being picked up after school and instruct them to wait with the entire party for the car to arrive.**

General Guidelines:

- **Only staff** may park in *reserved* parking spaces.
- Cars **MAY NOT** enter the parking lot through the bus entrance.
- **Only park in designated spots, cars that are double parked will be ticketed**
- Cars **MAY NOT** pull up to the front of the school (in the bus lane)
- Students **MAY NOT** be dropped off by the buses and may only be picked up from the designated area.
- Adults and safety patrols will be present to lead these procedures. It is imperative students and families follow their directions.

Failure to follow these procedures may result in disciplinary action. Remember, our primary concern is the safety of our students, staff, and visitors. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the school.

Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

Reminder: If Prince Georges County Schools are closed or delayed, the town office will be closed. Remember the town office is only opened on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday, 9am-1pm.

Attn: Handicap Residents with handicap sign in front of their residence

If you are a disabled resident in the Town of North Brentwood, the town has provided you with the courtesy of handicap parking in front of your residence. Unfortunately due to strict Maryland State Laws and to keep a conflict from arising on your residential street it is very important that you contact MVA at 1-800-950-1682 to officially reserve a parking space near your home. Anyone who has State issued handicap tags or a handicap placard in the front window of the vehicle is allowed to park in front of a handicap sign.

You should request an application for personal residential permit for a reserved parking space from the MVA. You may obtain the form.

By calling or mailing a request to the MVA investigation and security services division.

In person from an MVA branch office.

By calling the MVA fax on demand system (410) 424-3050

By downloading a copy from the MVA's website on the internet. (www.mva.maryland.gov)

When the application is completed and returned, the MVA investigation and Security Services (ISS) division will review the application to see whether any of the following conditions exist that may disqualify your request.

Your doctor certifies your disability is not permanent.

Your residence is located in a private community or is located on a private roadway.

Off-street parking is already available (examples garage, driveway, parking pad).

No member of your household has a Maryland registered vehicle.

Your residence is on a street where parking is prohibited.

There are no fees charged to reserve the parking space, for additional information and questions please contact the customer service center at 1-410-768-7000.

The Town of North Brentwood needs a current copy of your disability documentation that is kept on file for the Town records, this documentation should be kept current and a copy should be given to the Town every time it is renewed.

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) will be opening the Air Traffic Controllers Exam to the public in February 2014. This is a great opportunity to expose your community to the various careers in the aviation industry.

Please ask the interested parties to purchase the test preparation booklet - ATC Exam, from Amazon.com or check with www.atca.org to find out if there are training sessions with retired ATC in your area. This booklet isn't required for the official exam by the FAA, but is highly recommended to improve their official scores. For applications for FAA-Air Traffic Controllers go to www.USAJobs.gov

Air Traffic Controllers (Median wage \$122,000 year, entry level Associates Degree)

If you're looking for an exciting, challenging and rewarding aviation career, become an FAA Air Traffic Controller. Twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week, controllers are on the job separating aircraft at over 350 locations across the country.

Qualifications and Training Requirements

Applicants must be a U.S. citizen, under 30 years of age and pass a physical exam, drug screening and criminal background check. Job aptitude tests may also be required.

Related military air traffic control experience or two-to-four years of college in aviation-related degrees are ideal paths to qualifying (see [Air Traffic Collegiate Training Initiative Program \(AT-CTI\) Schools](#)). Three years of progressive work experience (commercial pilot, navigator or air dispatcher experience), or a combination of college and work experience, may also qualify you.

ATC training includes an intensive three-month training course at the [FAA Academy](#). Class work and supervised on-the-job training may continue for two to four years depending on career specialties and the nature of the facility you are assigned.






